Fourth Annual African Centered Educational Conference

The Lotus Academy will be hosting its fourth annual African-centered Educational Conference. The event is sponsored by the Whole Life Institute, and is intended to provide a forum for educators, administrators, parents, and supporters to obtain information about African-centered education and its implementation in the various institutions around the country.

The conference will take place over two days: Friday, May 17th and on Saturday, May 18th. The hours for both days are 9:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. In order to accommodate the event, Friday is a day of noon dismissal at Lotus. There is no charge for any of the workshops or other activities, and lunch can be purchased on both days for a very moderate price.

The theme for this year's conference is "Building Bridges: Fostering A Community of African-Centered Educators". The objective is to put systems into place that will allow all of those who are involved in African centered education to communicate with each other, share resources, and develop a network that will allow everyone to benefit from the many experiences of others.

Any interested person is welcome to attend the conference on either day, though the Friday session will be focused more on issues that are of interest to educators and administrators. The Saturday session will be directed more towards parents and community people, and will also feature the commemoration of the birthday of Malcolm X.

The Lotus Academy exists for one reason only, and that is because there are people who are dedicated to the notion that our children become better students and healthier adults if they are exposed to learning in a system and setting that reflects their own culture and identity. This mission and message is at the core of Lotus' academic, character development, and cultural program.

We think that it is vital that we take time to discuss these issues with others who are trying to promote it in their own way, and to learn from their example. The conference is our way of bringing people together for that express purpose.

Friday will begin with a special Opening with all of the Lotus staff and students (along with our guests). It will continue with classroom demonstrations, workshops, and a networking reception. Speakers will be used to explain the goals of the conference and to put it all into a real perspective.

We will start Saturday with workshops in the morning, and it will continue with student presentations, movies, and a panel discussion about the issues that have been raised. There will be special activities that will be devoted to the legacy of Malcolm X whose birthday is actually May ?? We look forward to our parents attending this important event. Computer Science Program Update

The computer science program at Lotus continues to be one of its most successful aspects. As the photos on the back page illustrate, our program begins with our Shana and Shaish students, and builds upon the knowledge they acquire as they move on and up to the Vishna age-group.

In fact, plans have already been completed (and the funds have been secured) to put in a computer lab at the Early Learning Center for our three and four-year olds. Of course, the foundation of our program there will continue to be developmental and social growth, but there will be some time spent making sure that they at least become familiar with the notion of computing.

The computer lab in the main building was recently upgraded. All of the computers there had considerably more memory installed so that they would be able to handle some of the new programs that are much more demanding than those that we started the program with. Mothura Evelyn's computer was also upgraded and more tightly upgraded into the network.

The computer lab has also been reequipped with a program called "Net Ops Ed" that allows Mothura Evelyn to monitor, control, and direct all of the students' computers from her central station. She can see what every student has on their monitor as they work on a project or surf the Internet. She can also decide what every student will be working on by having her work appear on each student's monitor.

The staff is also a part of this ever-expanding information technology revolution. In addition to every classroom having its own computer and high speed Internet connection, several of the staff have recently purchased new computers, and are extending their education about them outside of Lotus

All of the Lotus teaching and administrative staff now have e-mail addresses that end with @lotusacademy.org, as we all prepare to make much more extensive use of e-mail for our various internal communications. Because e-mail is instantaneous (and also paperless), it is a much more efficient way to exchange vital information.

There are several more classes that are planned for this trimester, and we will be repeating some of those that were conducted last year (the three most popular ones were "Computer Fundamentals", "E-Mail And Its Many Uses", and "Surfing And Searching The World Wide Web". New classes that are being organized include "Digital Photography And Video", "PowerPoint", and "HTML: The Language Of The World Wide Web".

We are still pursuing our goal of every parent being able to be connected to Lotus through a home computer (and the Internet) by the 2002-2003 school year. Watch the *Lotus Lamp* for more details as to how that program will be put into operation.
