

The much anticipated Mural Arts Project is now under way at our school and excitement is in the air! In January 2004, Lotus Academy was granted an approval for a mural to be completed under the direction of the Philadelphia Department of Recreation Mural Arts Program.

Shortly thereafter, several Lotus staff members met with Cathy Harris (Director of Community Murals), Eliseo Silva, and Teddy Harris (the two artists that have been commissioned to complete the mural). During this meeting, the group discussed Lotus' vision for the mural. The brainstorming session ended with a consensus on the desire to blend the themes of "jazz" along with "a celebration of 30 years of educating our African American children".

A future meeting is being planned to also include representation from of the Morton Homes community. Their input is very important to the project as the "voice of the community".
